Brief Summary

The purpose of this study is to assess the safety and efficacy of PRA023 in participants with moderately to severely active Ulcerative Colitis.

Cohort 2 of the study is to assess the safety and efficacy of PRA023 in participants with moderate to severe active ulcerative colitis who are companion diagnostic positive.

After the completion of the 12-week induction, all participants have the option to continue in the open-label extension phase.

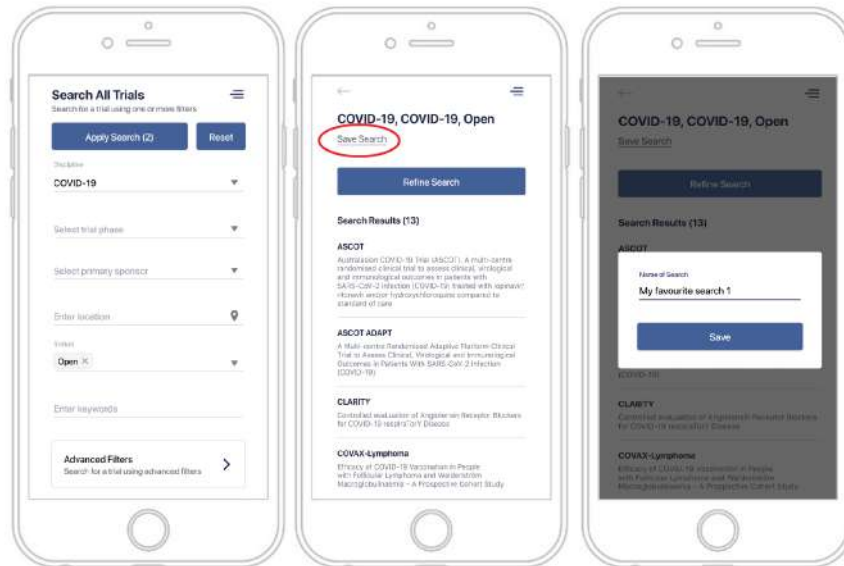

Did you know that to make searching easier and faster, you can save search parameters you frequently use in the ClinTrial Refer App to search again. Simply follow the instructions below:

How to Save a Search:

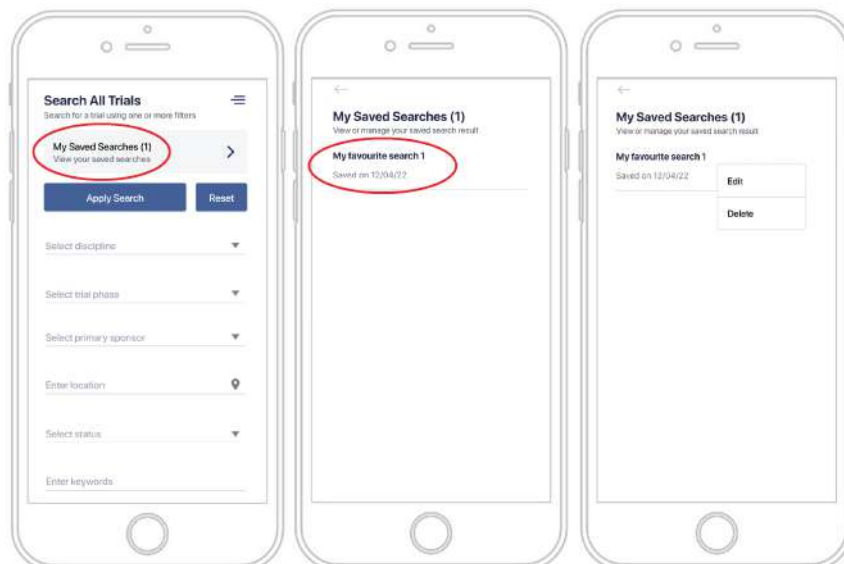
Saved searches are great time-savers for frequently-used search filters. Each time you use a Saved Search, it will complete a fresh search of the trial listings without needing to re-enter your search criteria.



Complete your frequently used filters that you would like to save, and click Apply Search.

Click Save Search.

Name your search.



Saved searches appear at the top of the search menu, click through to use them.

Click on the saved search to complete a fresh search using your saved filters.

Hold your finger on the search name to delete it or make changes to the filters used.
