

Tell us a little bit about yourself/your role in addition to managing the ClinTrial Refer App I am a Clinical Trial Assistant with a background as a Biomedical Researcher. In addition to managing the ClinTrial Refer platform, I work closely with the research team, healthcare professionals and patients to ensure the smooth execution of clinical trials by managing trial documentation, coordinating participant recruitment, ensuring supportive experiences of participants throughout the trial, and ensuring compliance with regulatory requirements.

### Why do you think Clinical trials are important?

Clinical trials are of paramount importance because they serve as the bridge between scientific research and real-world patient care. From a researcher's viewpoint, clinical trials represent the culmination of years of rigorous scientific inquiry, laboratory studies, and preclinical research. Clinical trials allow researchers to validate their research findings in real-world settings and to enhance their understanding of diseases and the treatment. The invaluable data gained from clinical trials not only informs current research but also guides future studies and therapeutic strategies. From a patient's perspective, participating in a clinical trial can give patients access to innovative approaches that could potentially offer better outcomes than existing options.

Moreover, their willingness to share their experiences and data helps researchers understand

diseases and treatments, which ultimately benefits the entire medical field.

#### If you could wave a magic wand and change one thing in clinical trials what would it be?

If I could wave a magic wand and change one thing in clinical trials, I would enhance the speed and efficiency of patient recruitment. Too often, recruitment challenges lead to delays in trials and can limit the ability to obtain timely results. Streamlining the process of finding eligible participants and engaging them in trials would not only expedite the pace of research but also make potential life-changing treatments more available to those who need them.

# What's your favourite thing to do outside of work and making potentially life changing clinical trials more available to people that might need them?

Outside of work, I enjoy spending time with family, doing yoga and practicing mindfulness through meditation. These activities provide the balance and rejuvenation needed to tackle the challenges and responsibilities of my role in clinical trial management.

# **ACTA International Clinical Trials Symposium 2023**




